It is available to start-up firms, businesses that are expanding or relocating in South Dakota, as well as local economic development corporations. This low-interest Ioan can provide up to 45% of a project's total cost and requires a 10% minimum equity contribution. Projects can include: Iand purchases; site improvements; construction, acquisition or renovation of a building; or to the purchase and installation machinery and equipment. State Tax Credits

If you answered YES above, please describe the available tax credits: South Dakota has two tax incentive grant programs, the Reinvestment Payment Program and the South Dakota Jobs Program. The Reinvestment Payment Program provides reinvestment payments to projects in excess of \$20,000,000, or with equipment upgrades in excess of \$2,000,000. The awards are intended for projects that would not have occurred without the reinvestment payment. The South Dakota Jobs Program is available to assist companies in offsetting the upfront costs associated with relocating or expanding operations and/or upgrading equipment in South Dakota. The program allows for project owners to receive a South Dakota Jobs Grant for new or expanded facilities with project costs less than \$20,000,000, or for equipment upgrades with project costs less than \$2,000,000. The program is available to all economic development organizations, counties, cities, townships, planning districts, business improvement districts and developers, and is operated under the supervision of the Governor's Office of Economic Development (GOED).
